The goal of the Undergraduate Rattler Researcher (URR) experience is to provide students with a great opportunity to gain significant experiential learning, professional socialization and professional development in a mentored environment. We offer this opportunity campus-wide to all majors, colleges and schools. The start and ending dates for the fall are October 1st thru December 5th . Spring and summer dates TBD.

What to expect...

Students

Students will work up to 10 hours per week on a research project with a mentor.

Students will be required to work with their mentor to develop and submit a research plan.

Students will be required to submit pre and post assessment surveys.

Students will be expected to attend OUR professional development workshops.

Students will be responsible for uploading their time sheet with both mentor and student signatures to the appropriate portals.

Faculty Research Mentor

Mentors will be responsible for the development and implementation of student research objectives.

Mentors will be responsible for monitoring student work times and signing student time sheets.

Mentors will provide an end of semester assessment of student progress toward established research objectives and research skills.

Mentors will assist students with their research plan, progress report and end of semester report.
